

FINANCIAL AID FACT SHEET

Section 1

What types of financial aid are available? Who may be eligible?

- Peabody offers scholarships and assistantships; federal grants, loans, work-study
- To qualify for federal financial aid,
 - a student must be a US citizen or permanent resident,
 - accepted into an eligible degree program,
 - enroll at least 6 credits per term aid is awarded,
 - not be in default,
 - and not owe any repayments on federal grants

Section 2

How do I apply for institutional aid?

- All entering students are evaluated for Peabody scholarship at the time of the application for admission
- New, in-coming international students should file the CSS Profile Application for Scholarship and Financial Aid; and submit supporting documents upon request; the form is available at <https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org/> with school code 5532

Are there other assistance options?

- Alternative loans from banks may be available to International Students who obtain a credit-worthy cosigner who is a US citizen or permanent resident. You may begin your search for a lender at www.elmselect.com.

- When building your financial plan for college, be sure to plan for the full length of your degree program, including annual tuition increases

- It is very important and necessary to take action to accept or decline your financial aid award in the SIS self-service portal. The results of this step will give you a better idea of your payment responsibility when bills are issued.
