having worked with professional musicians and students from all 50 states and more than 40 countries. They have been active in community outreach, including the founding of the Maryland Music Educator's mentorship program, to help new music teachers join and become involved in the professional community. The music education program distinguishes itself from other programs at the Conservatory by providing a broader experience in the liberal arts, including U.S. history, math, and science; an experience in a variety of musical instruments and in the use of the voice, especially applied to beginning and intermediate instruction; and an instruction in the learning processes of children at various stages of development and supervised teaching experiences in the local public schools.

### UNDERGRADUATE MUSIC EDUCATION PROGRAM

The Peabody Undergraduate Music Education Program is designed for the gifted performer who also has a special interest in sharing his or her musical expertise through teaching music in elementary or secondary schools.

### GRADUATE MUSIC EDUCATION PROGRAM

The Graduate Music Education Program is for those individuals who are practicing music educators and desire to further their teaching skills. The core curriculum consists of music bibliography, music theory, and music history courses.

### CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

The Certification Program is designed for individuals who hold a Bachelor of Music degree from an accredited institution and who wish to become certified by the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) to teach in the public schools.
