### COURSE DESCRIPTION

An intensive course designed to develop ensemble skills, examine vocal ensemble repertoire, and explore the possibilities of collaboration in a virtual space. Through conversation, listening, independent study, and virtual performance projects, students will develop an appreciation and understanding of the vocal ensemble art. Open to voice majors of all levels of study (undergraduate and graduate), this course offers an introduction to the knowledge and skills necessary to succeed as an independent *and* collaborative vocal artist, while also laying the groundwork for a new and progressive vocal ensemble culture at Peabody.

### COURSE GOALS

- 1) Educate and empower creative minds to collaborate and seek application across disciplines
- 2) Cultivate a healthy and unified community of bold and courageous musicians, equally committed to each other and the vocal ensemble art.
- 3) Make connections with the broader vocal ensemble community beyond Peabody
- 4) Build ensemble skills and a robust ensemble culture rooted in independent musicianship
- 5) Cultivate an appreciation and curiosity for vocal ensemble repertoire
- 6) Engage in conversations that will further the vocal ensemble art form in terms of diversity, equity, and inclusion

### SCHEDULE

**M, T, W, Th – 1:30-5:30 pm (students are expected to hold all times)**

**Total active time: 5 hrs (3.5 synchronous, 1.5+ asynchronous)**

1) Guest Artist Series

**Tue (and sometimes Thu) 3:30-5:00p**

(1.5 hr synchronous + 1.5 hr asynchronous prep as assigned)

2) Virtual Chamber Ensembles\* (2 hrs synchronous + asynchronous prep as assigned)

2 one-hour rehearsals per ensemble, on M+W or T+Th, scheduled within the following windows:

- M, W 1:30-2:30, 2:30-3:30, 3:30-4:30, 4:30-5:30
- T, Th 1:30-2:30, 2:30-3:30 (*Th 3:30-5:30 if needed*)

\*please note that you will have three rotations over the course of the semester, at which point your small ensemble assignment and schedule may change (see Course Outline).

## **GRADING**

- **60% Attendance, Participation, and Preparation. (synchronous\*)**
  - Attendance at and meaningful participation in weekly guest artist series and all weekly chamber ensemble rehearsals/coaching
  - Independent preparation of all ensemble repertoire in advance of first rehearsal, and between subsequent rehearsals as needed
- **20% Listening, Reading, and Written Assignments. (asynchronous)**
  - Completion of all assignments, and on-time submission of written responses
  - All assignments submitted/logged weekly on Blackboard, by Monday, 11:59pm
- **20% Virtual Performance Projects. (synchronous\*)**
  - Artistically superior contribution to, and on-time completion of, all virtual performance projects
  - Soundtrap projects will be checked “in studio” periodically throughout each rotation to assess individual/group progress
  - Final recordings must be posted to Blackboard by due dates indicated in Course Outline
  - All group recording projects will be graded on a basis of 50% individual contribution, 50% group contribution.

\*Students requiring asynchronous alternatives for synchronous activities should reach out the Ensemble Office to request an accommodation (see “Class Engagement”)
