PRE alumni have performed with Apollo's Fire (Cleveland Baroque Orchestra), Baltimore Consort, Chatham Baroque, Early Music Access, Folger Consort, Hesperus, the Indianapolis Early Music Festival Band, Les Arts Florissant, New York Collegium, Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra, Waverly Consort, and others.
