ARTISTIC TEAM BIOGRAPHIES

Brian Garman, conductor

Brian Garman is the artistic director and co-founder of Berkshire Opera Festival, conducting their inaugural production of *Madama Butterfly* in 2016, and every subsequent mainstage production. He also joined the Crested Butte Music Festival in 2018 as the new music director of Opera, leading a production of *Falstaff*. Prior to this, he opened Seattle Opera's season conducting *La traviata*, and the preceding fall was appointed the inaugural music director of the Seattle Opera Young Artists Program. He was previously on the conducting roster at New York City Opera and concurrently led runs of Verdi's *Un Giorno di Regno* and Chabrier's *L'Étoile* at Wolf Trap. Garman was resident conductor at Pittsburgh Opera for ten years, leading several productions to unanimous critical acclaim. Additionally, he was at the helm for numerous performances as music director of the Pittsburgh Opera Center. On the senior music staff of The Santa Fe Opera for six years, he was an associate conductor and assisted in the musical preparation of dozens of operas. As a pianist and coach, Garman is sought after by numerous singers of renown, and has been called upon frequently to give recitals and master classes around the United States and Europe.

Mary Duncan, director and choreographer

Mary Duncan recently directed the premieres of *Time and Chance* by Tony Award winning playwright Mark Medoff, and a new interpretation of *The Soldier's Tale* by Wordsmith with the BSO. She has directed over 50 operas at venues across the country. At the Kennedy Center, with the National Symphony Orchestra, she directed *Der Schauspieldirektor*, *Bastien und Bastienne*, and *La Clemenza di Tito*.

Duncan was associate artistic director of the Berkshire Opera Company for nine seasons where she directed 15 operas. Highlights include the world premiere of Stephen Paulus' *Summer*; *The Rake's Progress*; *Turn of the Screw*; *Susannah*; and *The Consul* released by Newport Classic. Other notable collaborations include the *Rape of Lucretia* with iconic designer Massimo Vignelli at BAM, and *The Magic Flute* with designs by acclaimed illustrator Eric Carle.

During a long association with The Aspen Music Festival, she directed and choreographed numerous operas including *Proving Up* by Missy Mazzoli, the American premiere of Luke Bedford's Seven Angels, Victory Over the Sun, Comedy on the Bridge, Renard, The Marriage of Figaro, Seven Deadly Sins, and Trouble in Tahiti. She is a graduate of The Juilliard School and studied at A.R.T. at Harvard assisting Robert Brustein.
